Dear Members and Friends of Trinity Cathedral,

We have shared laughter and tears, hard work and easy conversations, and God has been in our midst through it all. I’m convinced that much that has happened in our time together has been deep and significant, some of it perhaps even eternally.

I will continue to serve as Provost until the end of this month. Fr. Tim Hushion will then take over the helm as Priest-in-Charge. Be assured of my continuing prayers for you in the weeks and months ahead and know that I am very thankful for your prayers and support for me and Trinity during this time of transition.

May Christ Jesus bless, guide, and prosper us and our beloved Trinity Cathedral!
